

2010 BREEDER'S INVITATIONAL DERBY/CLASSIC/CHALLENGE RULES

2010 Nominations

1. To be held in Tulsa, Oklahoma – Tentative dates May 17 through May 29, 2010.
2. For four year olds (foals of 2006), made eligible by their Sire being subscribed to the Breeder's Invitational 2005 Breeding Season and 5/6 year olds made eligible by their Sire being a past or current subscribed Breeder's Invitational Stallion.

DERBY

3. The 2010 BI Derby will have eight classes: Open, Non-Professional, 10K Open, 10K Non Pro, Senior, Limited Open, Limited Non Pro, and Amateur. The 10K Open and 10K Non Pro is available to any eligible 2006 foal whose Life-Time Earnings, as reported by Equistat, does not exceed \$10,000 by May 1, 2010. The Senior class is for contestants that are fifty-five (55) years old or older and is held as a class within the Non-Pro, 10K Non Pro, and Amateur classes. The Limited Open is for Open riders that have not earned more than \$100,000 in NCHA earnings as of January 1, 2010 and is a class within the Open and 10K Open. The Limited Non Pro is for Non Pro riders that have not earned more than \$200,000 as of January 1, 2010 in NCHA earnings and is a class within the Non Pro and 10K Non Pro. A separate entry fee shall be paid per horse for each class. A horse may be entered in all classes (if eligible) or may be entered in any single class or combination of classes without being required to enter any another class except for the Senior class and the Limited Open and Limited Non Pro classes.
4. Owners may enter and riders may ride an unlimited number of horses in all classes.
5. \$390,000 of the added purse will be divided between the Open and Non-Pro classes in direct proportion to the entries qualifying in each class. \$50,000 will be added to the 10K Open, \$40,000 will be added to the 10K Non Pro, \$10,000 will be added to the Amateur class, \$10,000 will be added to the Limited Open class, \$10,000 will be added to the Limited Non Pro class, and \$10,000 will be added to the Senior class.
6. Entry Fees (includes video fee): Open & Non-Pro (\$2,160); 10K Open & 10K Non Pro (\$1,760), Senior (\$1,000); Amateur (\$1,010), Limited Open (\$1,000), and Limited Non Pro (\$1,000). If you enter the same horse in both the Open & 10K Open or the Non Pro and 10K Non Pro, deduct \$760.

CLASSIC/CHALLENGE

7. The 2010 BI Classic/Challenge will have five classes: Open, Non-Professional, Limited Open, Limited Non Pro and Amateur. The Limited Open is for Open riders that have not earned more than \$100,000 in NCHA earnings as of January 1, 2010 and is a class within the Open. The Limited Non Pro is for Non Pro riders that have not earned more than \$200,000 in NCHA earnings as of January 1, 2010 and is a class within the Non Pro. A separate entry fee shall be paid per horse for each class. A horse may be entered in all classes (if eligible) or may be entered in any single class or combination of classes without being required to enter any another class except for the Limited Open and Limited Non Pro classes.
8. Owners may enter and riders may ride an unlimited number of horses in all classes.
9. \$80,000 will be divided between the Open and Non-Pro classes in direct proportion to the entries qualifying in each class. \$5,000 will be added to the Amateur class and \$2,500 will be added to the Limited Open and Limited Non Pro classes.
10. Entry Fees (includes video fee): Open & Non-Pro (\$1,760); Amateur (\$1,260), Limited Open (\$750), and Limited Non Pro (\$750).

LATE FEES ARE 50% OF THE PAYMENT AMOUNT

* Entries may be added to the Derby 10K Open & 10K Non Pro if already entered in the respective Open or Non Pro classes with no penalty up until start of the 1st go round in the respective class. Entries in the Senior class, the Limited Open class and the Limited Non Pro class may be made with no penalty up until the start of the 1st go round in the respective class.

** Entries may be made after the draw but before the start of the 1st go round for a penalty of 100% of the original entry fee, with the draw into the 1st go round made according to NCHA guidelines.

*** An owner may substitute another horse that he owns for any horse within a class if that horse has not yet been shown in that class.

**** Any dishonored check will be charged an additional \$50 office charge.

11. Late Payments: Late payments will be allowed by paying all fees that are due plus Late Fees as described in Section 10.

A. All entry fees will be made payable to the Breeder's Invitational in United States Funds or its equivalent. **There will be a 10 day grace period.** Any payment postmarked after the grace period will be subject to a penalty according to the penalty schedule. All fees must be paid within the dates specified or entry may be cancelled without refund.

B. The draw will not take place more than fourteen (14) days prior to the beginning of the first scheduled go-round. Only those entries for which all payments have been received in the BI office will be drawn. There will be no exceptions. In the event that a horse properly entered is left out of the draw, a redraw will not be held. In order to establish a working order for this entry, the show management will draw one number based on the original draw numbers and insert the entry in the position drawn. The entry shall work behind the number drawn.

12. Transfer/Sale Privileges

A. Entries in all Open and Non Pro classes may be sold or transferred prior to April 15, 2010, by notifying the BI office via fax or mail, signed by both the seller and the buyer without any penalty.

B. Entries in all Open and Non Pro classes may be sold or transferred after April 15, 2010 but prior to the draw for a fee of \$100.

C. Entries in all Open and Non Pro classes may be sold or transferred after the draw but prior to the 1st go round for a fee of \$250.

D. Entries in the Amateur classes may be sold or transferred after April 15, 2010 but prior to the 1st go round for a fee of \$100.

E. In all sales or transfers entry must be paid up to date, including late fees due if applicable.

13. Refunds:

A. A refund is applicable for those Horses that are double entered in the Derby Open or Non-Pro and their respective 10K classes, who have become disqualified as a result of earnings that exceed \$10,000. The refund amount will be \$1,000.00. Horses that are entered in the 10K class only and subsequently become ineligible will automatically be entered in the respective Open or Non-Pro main class and will be charged an additional fee of \$400.00.

B. No other refunds will be given.

14. Identification of Horses: A photocopy of the registration certificate must be forwarded to the BI business office with each entry. A horse is not eligible to participate in the Breeder's Invitational Derby if its age, as determined by examination of its teeth, does not correspond to the age shown on its registration certificate, such determination by dentition examination to be made in accordance with The Official Guide for Determining the Age of the Horse as currently published by the American Association of Equine Practitioners. The board of Directors of the Breeder's Invitational has the right to request DNA certification of any horse entered prior to the event. The expense for this testing shall be paid for by the horse owner in advance. All finalists in all classes may be DNA sampled by the Breeder's Invitational. The expense for any finalist sampling will be paid by the Breeder's Invitational. If for lack of co-operation or results of the test, the Directors have the right to disqualify any entry from the competition and keep any entry fees paid and any premiums earned.

15. Derby Trials/Go-Rounds: All horses entered will work in the Derby Trials to be held before the actual Derby Finals provided they meet all previous stated requirements. The Derby Trials/Go-Rounds for the 10K classes will be run jointly with the main class in both the Open and Non-Pro. The Open and Non Pro Trials shall consist of two go-rounds. At the conclusion of the first go-round only the high scoring sixty percent (60%) with a maximum of one hundred twenty (120) plus ties will advance to the second Trials go-round and that all other horses will be dropped from further competition. The number of horses to advance to the finals shall be equal to twenty percent (20%) of those horses competing in the class

- with a maximum of twenty (20) plus ties. Those advancing to the finals shall be based on the aggregate score from the Trials go-rounds. The Amateur class will have one go-round. The Senior class scores will be determined by the highest score in the Amateur go round or the 1st go round of the Non Pro/10K Non Pro. Senior class contestants who are entered in both the Amateur and Non Pro/10K Non Pro classes will be entitled to select which class they wish to determine their Senior score. If they fail to make a choice prior to the beginning of the first class to show, that class will automatically be selected.
16. Wild Card Round: In the Derby Open and Non Pro classes, the next ten (10) highest scoring horses plus ties that did not make the finals will compete in a Wild Card round in which two of these horses will advance to the finals. If there are more than 200 entries in the class, the number of horses advancing from the Wild Card round will be a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 5 to make up a 25 horse finals. In the case of ties in the Wild Card round scores from all five judges will be used to break the ties. If still tied, a tiebreaker judge will be designated. Only horses with a score of 180 or more will be allowed to advance. The remaining horses will split a purse of \$16,800 per class. A \$250 advancement fee will be charged for each horse in the round.
 17. Derby Finals (All Classes): Upon qualifying for the Derby Finals, horses will owe no further fees to remain eligible except that horses that make the finals in divisions where no cattle charge was paid will be charged a \$250 advancement fee. The remaining original nomination fees and the added purse monies will be paid in the Derby Finals. Premium money will be paid to all finalists with last place earning 10% of first place. Scores made in the Trials to be disregarded completely, with scores made in the Derby Finals only to determine placings. In the event of a tie for the Championship in any division, a work off will be held to determine the Champion. For all other ties the premiums will be added together and split equally. The Limited Open and Limited Non Pro classes will only have a working final if there are at least 50 entries in the respective class. If less than 50, finals payout will be based on the aggregate score from the Trials go-rounds.
 18. Classic/Challenge Trials/Go-Rounds: All horses entered will work in the Classic Challenge Trials to be held before the actual Classic Challenge Finals provided they meet all previous stated requirements. At the conclusion of the first go-round only the high scoring sixty percent (60%) with a maximum of one hundred twenty (120) plus ties will advance to the second Trials go-round and that all other horses will be dropped from further competition. The Amateur class will have one go-round. The number of horses to advance to the finals shall be equal to twenty percent (20%) of those horses competing in the class with a maximum in the Amateur class of twenty (20) plus ties and a maximum in the Open and Non Pro classes of twenty-five (25) plus ties. Those advancing to the finals shall be based on the aggregate score from the Trials go-rounds.
 19. Consolation Purse: In the Classic Challenge Open and Non Pro classes, if there are 100 or more horses in the class, the next five (5) highest scoring horses plus ties that did not make the finals will split a consolation purse of \$7,500 in each class.
 20. Classic Challenge Finals (All Classes): Upon qualifying for the Classic Challenge Finals, horses will owe no further fees to remain eligible. The remaining original nomination fees and the added purse monies will be paid in the Derby Finals. Scores made in the Trials to be disregarded completely, with scores made in the Finals only to determine placings. In the event of a tie for the Championship in any division, a work off will be held to determine the Champion. For all other ties the premiums will be added together and split equally. The Limited Open and Limited Non Pro classes will only have a working final if there are at least 50 entries in the respective class. If less than 50, finals payout will be based on the aggregate score from the Trials go-rounds.
 21. Judges: Five judges will be named to judge the event from those eligible judges on the BI Approved Judges List who have indicated their probable availability. All judges will be under the direct supervision of the NCHA Judges Monitor.
 22. Judging:
 - A. Each judge will score every horse and the highest and lowest scores for each horse will be discarded. The total of the remaining three scores will be the horse's official mark.
 - B. No individual score cards will be posted; however, photo copies of all judges' cards will be posted.
 - C. All score cards will be retained for three years and will then be destroyed.
 - D. The NCHA Adjusted Monitor System and all rules and polices set forth by that system will be used.
 23. All rules of the National Cutting Horse Association not in direct conflict with the rules of the Breeder's Invitational Derby shall apply.
 24. These rules subject to change by action of the BI Board of Directors.
